I. Key data on HPV and HPV-related cancers



Guinea-Bissau has a population of 639,571 women ages 15 years and older who are at risk of developing cervical cancer. Current estimates indicate that every year 239 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer and 172 die from the disease. Cervical cancer ranks as the 1st most frequent cancer among women in Guinea-Bissau and the 1st most frequent cancer among women

between 15 and 44 years of age. Data is not yet available on the HPV burden in the general population of Guinea-Bissau. However, in Western Africa, the region Guinea-Bissau belongs to, about 4.3% of women in the general population are estimated to harbour cervical HPV-16/18 infection at a given time, and 55.6% of invasive cervical cancers are attributed to HPVs 16 or 18.


