## Human Papillomavirus and Related Cancers, Fact Sheet 2023 (2023-03-10)

## I. Key data on HPV and HPV-related cancers



Pakistan has a population of 73.8 million women ages 15 years and older who are at risk of developing cervical cancer. Current estimates indicate that every year 5008 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer and 3197 die from the disease. Cervical cancer ranks as the

3rd most frequent cancer among women in Pakistan and the 2nd most frequent cancer among women between 15 and 44 years of age. About 0.5% of women in the general population are estimated to harbour cervical HPV-16/18 infection at a given time, and 88.1% of invasive cervical cancers are attributed to HPVs 16 or 18.




