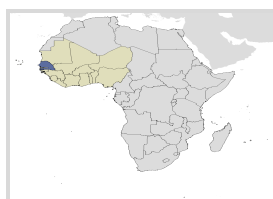

Human Papillomavirus and Related Cancers, Fact Sheet 2017 (2017-07-27)



I. Key data on HPV and HPV-related cancers



Senegal has a population of 4.43 millions women ages 15 years and older who are at risk of developing cervical cancer. Current estimates indicate that every year 1482 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer and 858 die from

the disease. Cervical cancer ranks as the 1st most frequent cancer among women in Senegal and the 1st most frequent cancer among women between 15 and 44 years of age. About 2.3% of women in the general population are estimated to harbour cervical HPV-16/18 infection at a given time, and 44.7% of invasive cervical cancers are attributed to HPVs 16 or 18.

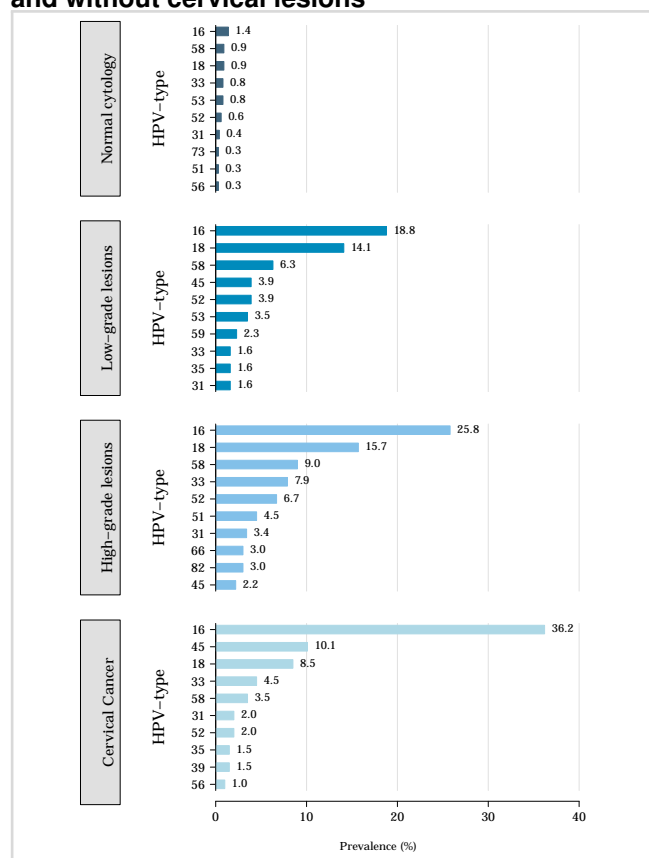

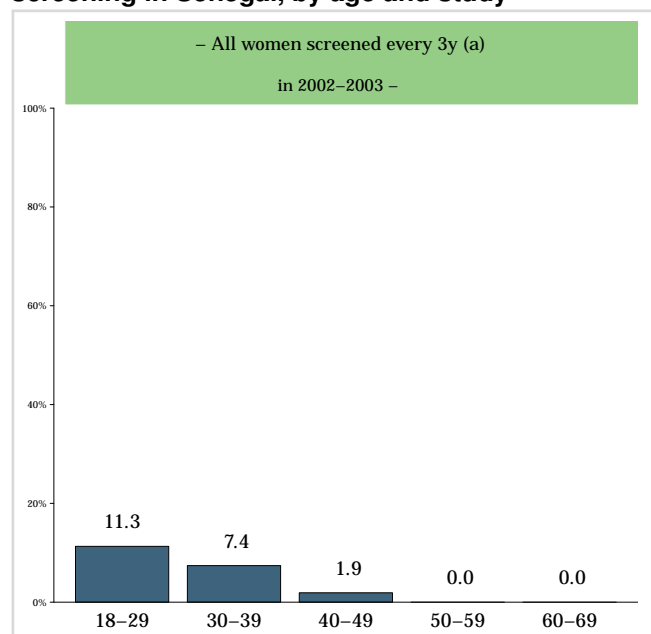
